The objective of the AfricaConnect Feasibility Study (the FEAST project) is to examine the viability of working with African NRENs and other stakeholders to establish a sustainable and expandable regional research network infrastructure in Africa, starting among the currently most developed NRENs in Southern and Eastern Africa, and to provide recommendations to the EC on the deployment of such a regional network and its interconnection to GÉANT. The study will also look at NREN organisations and capacity to ensure that international bandwidth can be distributed to end users.
