WWRF Liaison Agreement



- **Common objectives**
 - To identify and promote research areas for mobile and wireless systems
 - To drive future development in mobile and wireless communications
 - To enhance cooperation between industry players, the research community and public authorities
 - To identify and assess the potential of new technologies and trends for mobile and wireless systems
 - To develop a mid- to long-term vision to maximize the benefits of mobile and wireless communications
 - To contribute to the definition of international and national research programmes
 - To inform a wider audience about research activities that are focused on mobile and wireless systems

WWRF Liaison Agreement



• Agreements

- To exchange information on programmes of work in areas of mutual interest in the field of mobile communications
 - To nominate observers (without voting rights)
 - To participate in discussions on relevant work items
 - To submit written contributions
 - To submit technical proposals to the chairperson of the Technical Body or Working Group in which they are participating
 - Other areas of cooperation may include the cross-advertising of WWRF and eMobility events and activities

Memorandum of Understanding

- **EPISTEP key activities to support eMobility**
 - Access to a pan European Database profiling areas of expertise and requirements of least 1500 SMEs operating in the IST ETP sectors
 - Operation of specialized brokerage events organized within the framework of the annual eMobility conference
 - Dissemination of information via the EPISTEP website
 - Provision of a link to eMobility website
 - Raise awareness on eMobility's SRA objectives amongst SMEs
 - Collection of feedback from SMEs on eMobility's SRA
 - **Survey on SME preferences on how to be involved in FP7**

SME Conference in Namur eMobility

- **Focused on SMEs and Universities in Belgium interested in participating in FP7 and the ICT ETPs**
 - **Great interest of the about 60 participants in the development of the ETPs present (ARTEMIS, eMobility, ENIAC, ISI, NEM, NESSI)**
 - **Uncertainty relating to the adoption of FP7, future Workplans and the role of the ETPs**
 - **ETPs are seen as a representative body to help to assess future developments and position the own R&D work**
 - **Some organizations present consider joining eMobility or other ETPs closest to their focus of interest**

Conclusions

- After platform-internal discussions the 4 platforms agreed to cooperate e.g. for showing how the platforms could contribute to a broadband infrastructure for Europe
 - Most advanced status of the SRA
 - Largest ICT platform (actually >400 members)
 - Following the information and discussion on the national priorities and activities it was agreed to propose to the respective platform boards
 - to address the planned action and
 - to prepare a joint position statement

Agreement on test-beds

- **At both meetings (Dublin, February 22nd 2006 and Helsinki, June 20th 2006) the Panlab activity was discussed and suggested to be used by the ETPs.**
 - **Panlab provides access to required platforms, networks and services for broad interoperability testing.**
 - **Panlab enables the trial and evaluation of service concepts, technologies, system solutions and business models.**
